

Raising funds for your club


Engagement with the local community

Its the perfect time - people are looking for alternative socially distant activities


Its a fun activity to run



2. How to run a pay and play session

Initial set up

- Find a good time to run your sessions
- You might think your club is already busy but there is always a slot!
- Get members on board to run them
- Initially ask for a no commitment expression of interest



- Try setting up the lawns using half size pitches
- Think about what you will teach them:
 GC is easy to grasp
 5 Hoop games are quick and simple

2. How to run a pay and play session

Running sessions

Arrival

- Greetings, check tickets, sign in

Game set up (max 5 mins)


- Explain the equipment involved
- Brief introduction to the rules
- Give them a laminated rules sheet

During play


- Use a hands off approach
- Be available for questions
- Check in on them every so often

Alternative games


- Offer a mini tournament





General principles


What message are you conveying?

Total beginners, garden champions, and tournament winners - welcome to HWCC.



Guide to Five Hoop Croquet

Five Hoop Croquet is a quick and simple adaptation of the rules of Golf Croquet. The rules are as follows:

- Play as individuals (up to 4) or in teams of 2 (one ball each).
- Players take alternating turns. The blue ball starts, followed by red, black, then yellow. There are no additional turns.
- The first player or team to go through a hoop wins the hoop and receives 1 point! All players now proceed to the next hoop. No one else need go through the won hoop.
- Make sure not to go more than halfway to the next hoop before the current hoop is won or you will be offside and your ball will be sent to the penalty area.
- Once the fifth hoop has been won, the player or team with the most points wins the game! Please, turn over for the direction of play.


